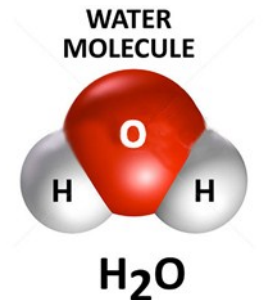
Indigenous Initiative for Training in Water and Wastewater Management

TIME FRAME: May 28th to June 30th 2017

LOCATION: University of Manitoba, Fort Garry Campus

PARTICIPANTS OBTAIN:

- ✓ GED preparation and testing for a Manitoba High School Equivalency Certificate
- ✓ Education relevant to the Water and Wastewater Industry:
 - Math and Science Upgrade (Worth 3 CEUS)
 - Water Treatment Level 1 Exam Preparation
- ✓ Connection to industry experts; job search tools; and career planning support
- ✓ 8 months of weekly follow-up support



ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum grade 10; At least 19 years of age; Indigenous ancestry (Status, Non-Status, Inuit, Metis); and Eligible for funding support or able to pay for travel and accommodations.

COURSE OUTLINE:

Traditional Teachings and Sweat Ceremony - May 28th

Introduction to Water and Wastewater Management and a Tour of a Water Treatment Plant - May 29th

GED Preparation - May 30th to June 16th

GED Testing - June 16th (evening) and June 17th (day)

Math and Science Upgrade - June 19th to June 23rd

Water Treatment Level 1 Exam Prep Course * - June 26th to June 29th

Water Treatment Level 1 Exam - June 30th

* Participants will not be expected to take the Exam Prep Course if they are not ready. They will instead continue with the Math and Science Upgrade component, and be provided with information on next steps.

For this pilot project there are no tuition fees. Participants are asked to cover their travel and accommodations. Accommodations can be provided from the University of Manitoba's Student Residences at a discounted rate.
